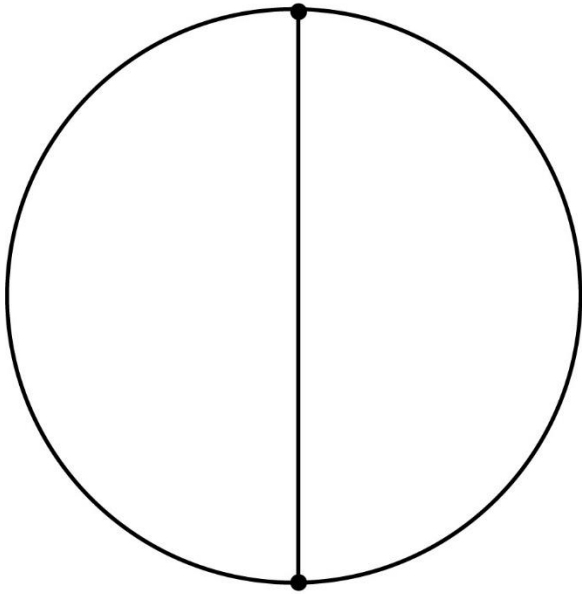
Hexagon is abstract of second ir dingir sign.

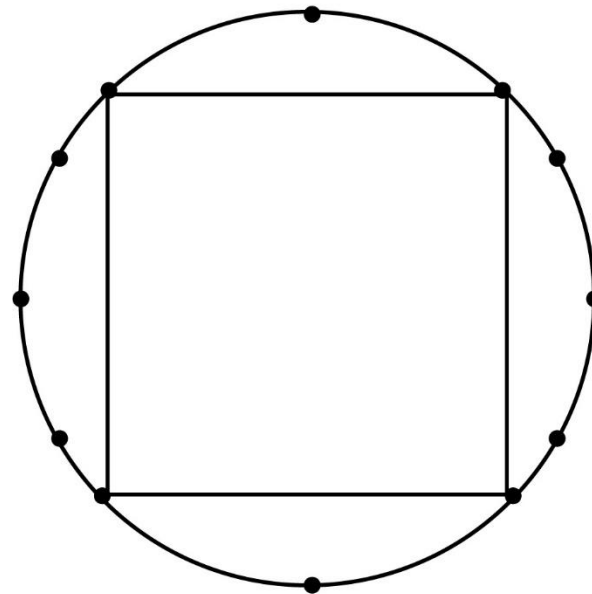
The circumscribed triangle.

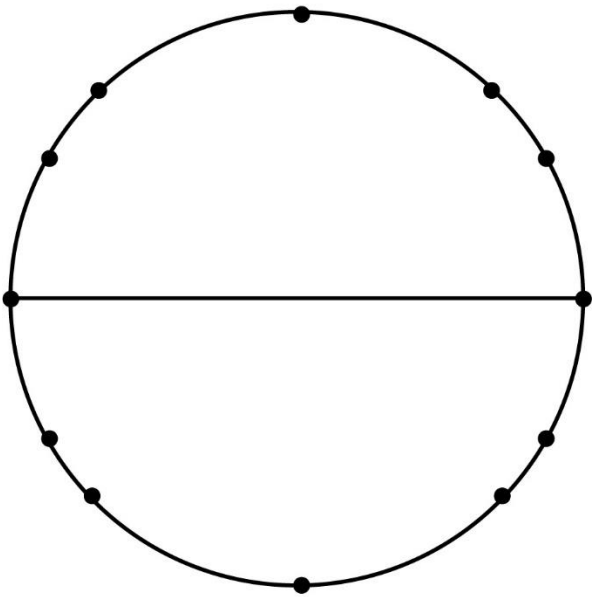

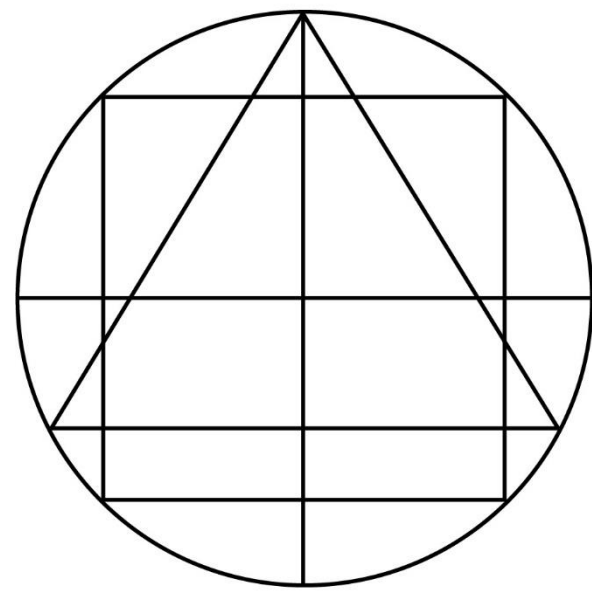

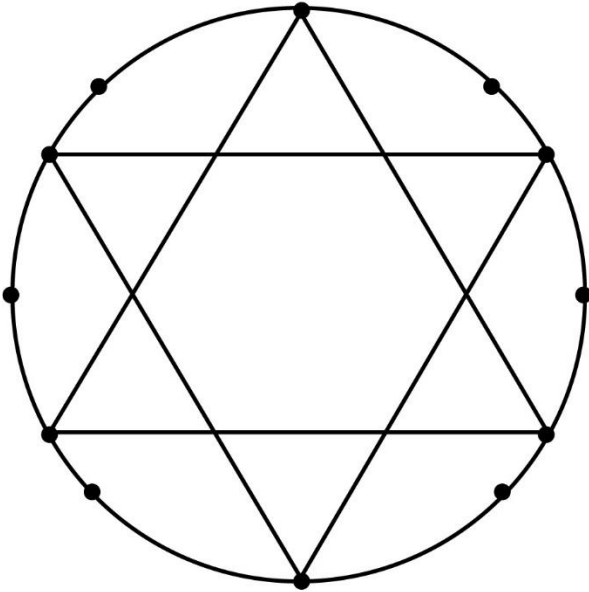

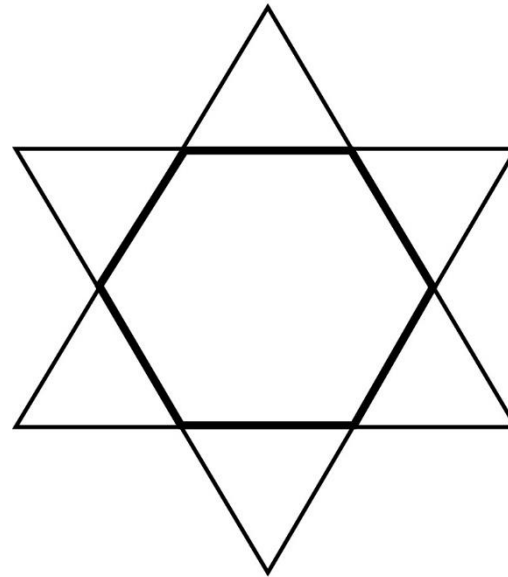
Result of superposing Figs. 2, 4, 5, 6, and 7.

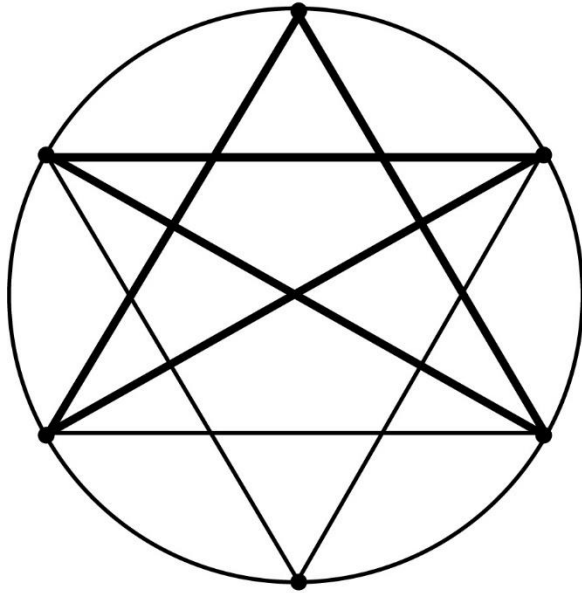

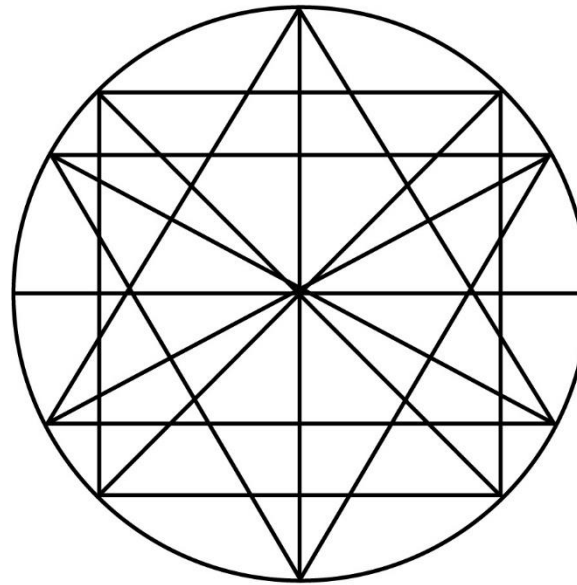

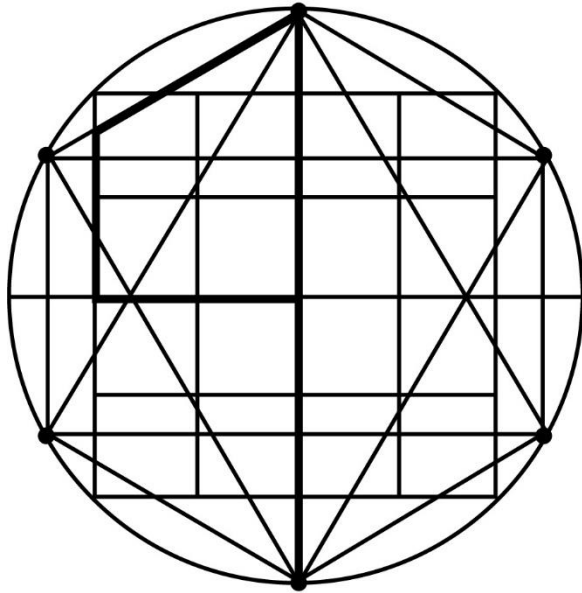

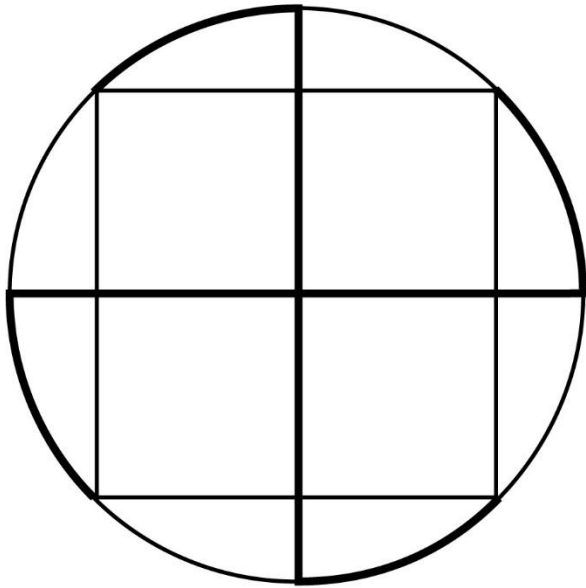

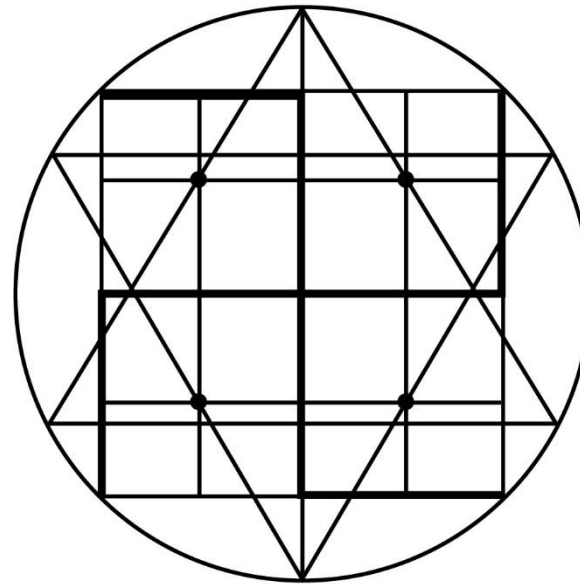

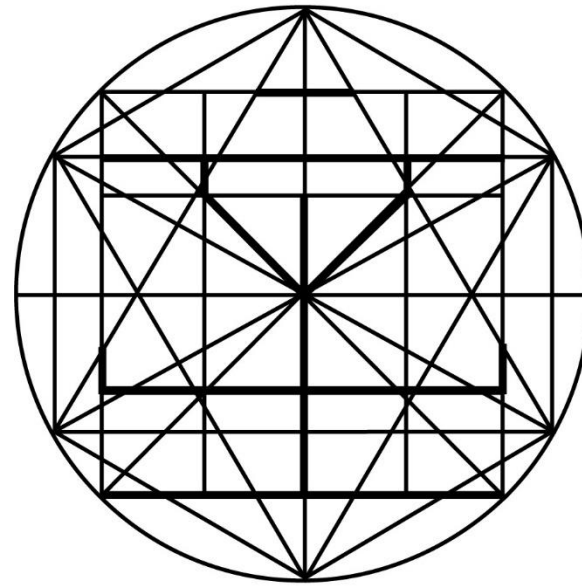

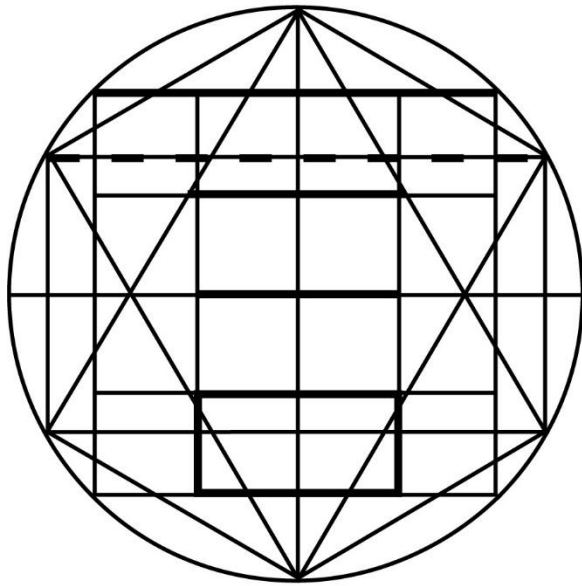

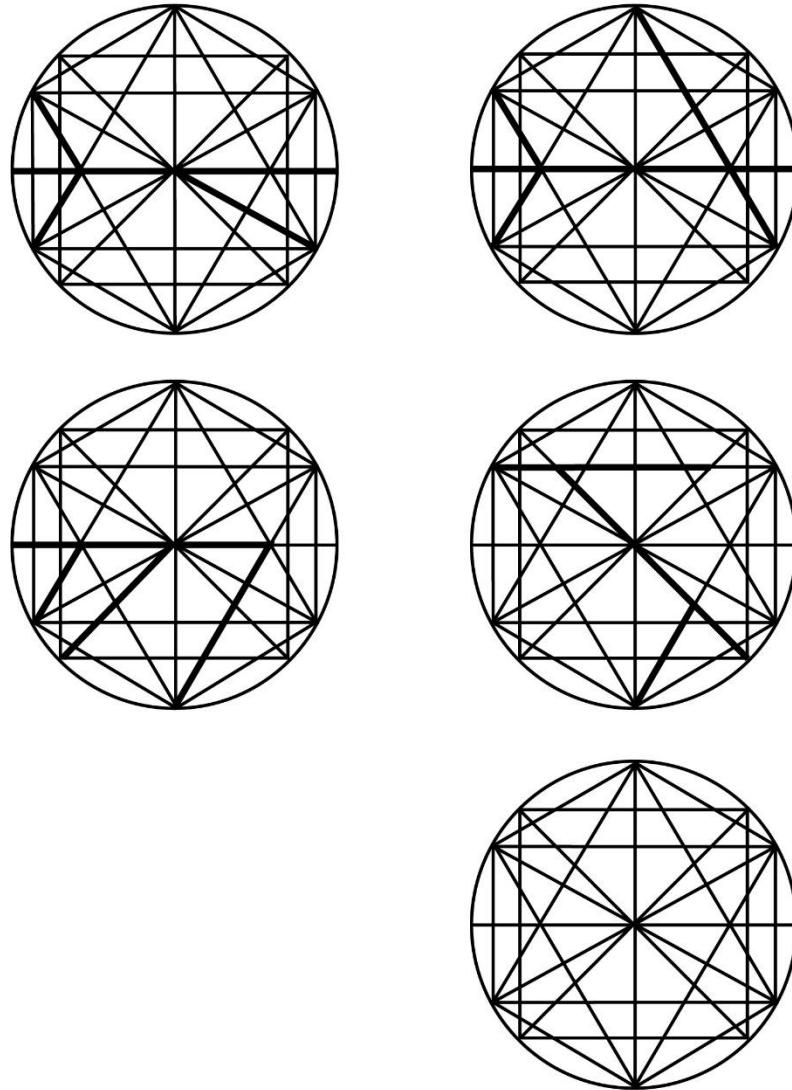

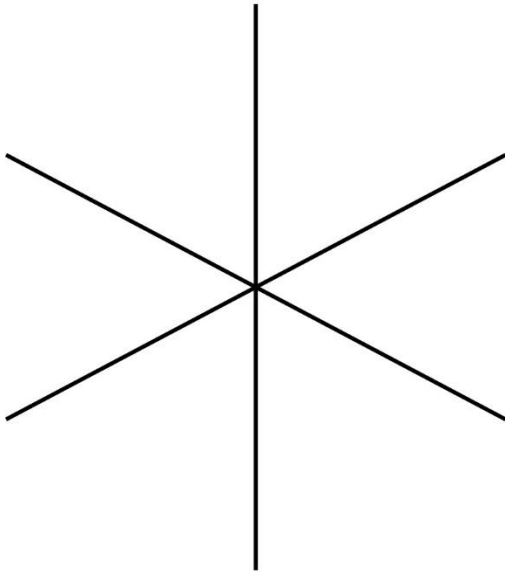

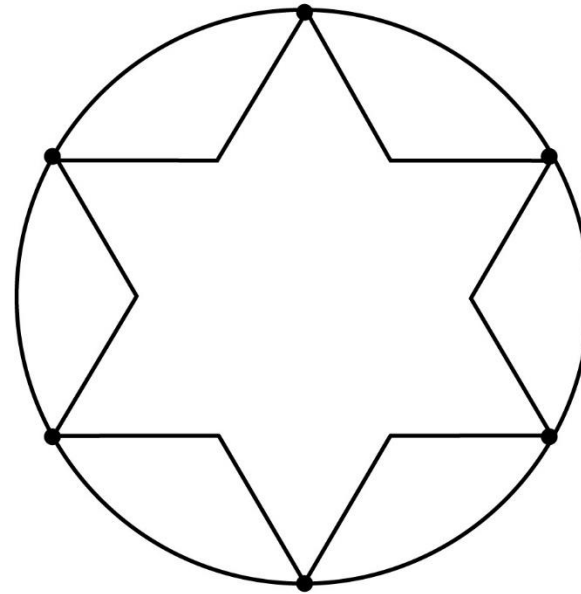
