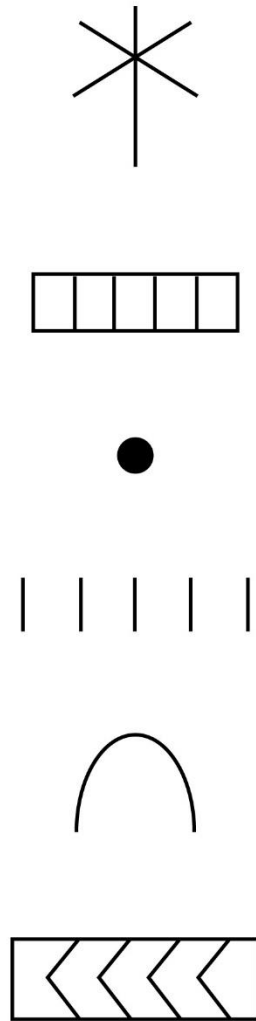

Some prehistoric signs on pottery from Egypt as shown in David Diringer's *The Alphabet*, (New York Philosophical Library, 1948) p. 24.

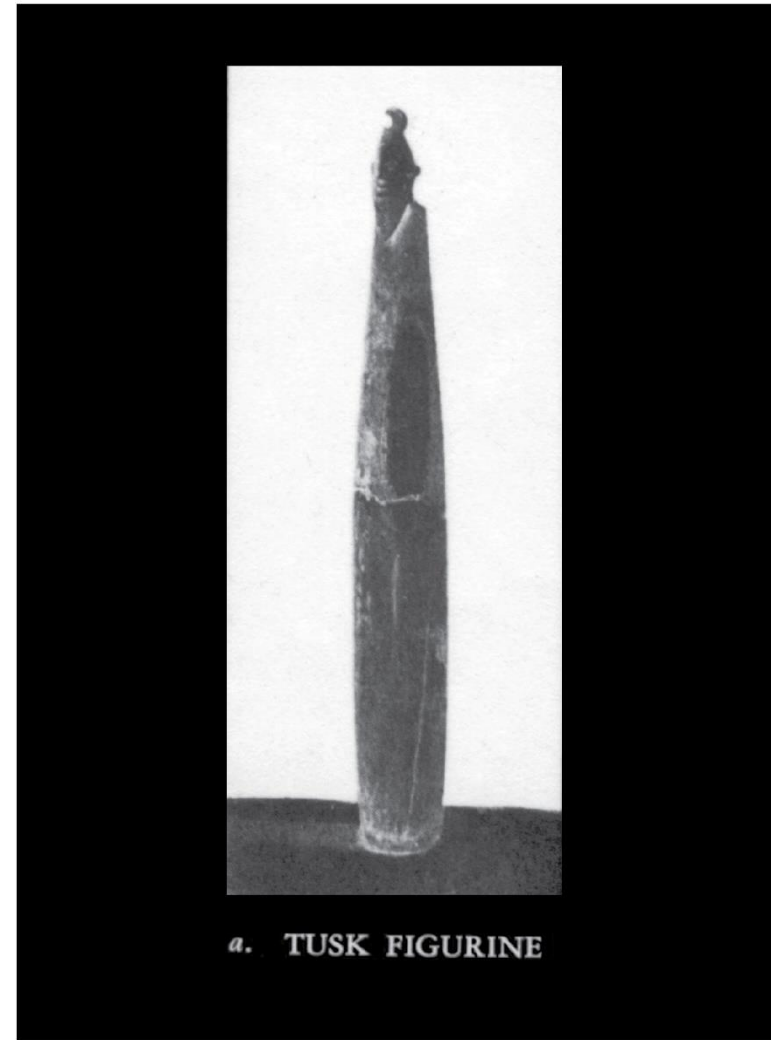
